
FAMILY DISCIPLESHIP GUIDE

WEEK 3 STAND FIRM



FAMILY DISCIPLESHIP IS KIND OF A BIG DEAL.

Deuteronomy 6:4-7 instructs parents to make God front and centre in home life; talking with children, impressing upon them and working with them at all times of the day and night. Put simply a parent's primary ministry is to raise their children to be disciples of Jesus.

For some of you it's already a regular part of the rhythm of your family's week; keep up the good work. Some of you will feel like you could be doing better; keep on trying, practice builds confidence and competence. And some of you feel overwhelmed and don't know where to start; that's ok, your church family is here to help.

Our prayer is that this Family Discipleship Guide will give you some helpful tools in developing a weekly rhythm of discipleship practices to help you and your family to grow together in love and service of God.



We've broken the guide in into 5 parts each with its own specific way of engaging the bible passage that week:

REFLECT encourages family members to reflect on the bible passage and what it means to them.

REACT engages your emotions and helps bringing those reactions before God.


RELATE encourages families to share honestly, and listen deeply to how one another are growing as disciples.

RESPOND helps families to work out real and practical ways they can respond to God in light of the weekly bible passage.

REVIEW encourages families to review the bible passage for the week and engage with it in a different way.

You might like to use these as 5 separate daily devotions, OR you might like to group some of the sections together to make a couple of family devotional times but leave yourself room to use other resources you've found elsewhere. Remember these are a collection of tools, not rules, for family discipleship.

BIBLE READING

Daniel 3

BIG IDEA

The unwavering faith of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego foreshadows Jesus' commitment to stay faithful to God even to death. So when faced with persecution for faithfulness to God, we can also stand firm in the assurance that we have this eternal salvation in Him.

KIDS BIG IDEA

Shadrach, Meshach & Abednego show commitment to God when it meant death, just like Jesus. So when we are made fun of, or bullied for trusting God, we can be confident that Jesus has saved us and is with us when we suffer.

KIDS APPLICATION

When we are made fun of, or bullied for trusting God, we can be confident that Jesus has saved us and is with us when we suffer. Find support with other Christians facing the same thing.

KEY VERSE

Daniel 3:17-18 - "If we are thrown into the blazing furnace, the God we serve is able to deliver us from it, and he will deliver us from Your Majesty's hand. But even if he does not, we want you to know, Your Majesty, that we will not serve your gods or worship the image of gold you have set up."

MOMENTS

To remember how King Nebuchadnezzar demanded that his people bow to him whenever they heard music, introduce a game where you begin playing music suddenly at random times throughout the week and the kids must stop and drop to the floor like the Babylonians had to.

If your kids share times in their life when they feel opportunities to share God's good news, make a point to pray about this before those activities (e.g. If there is a friend in their dance class or sports team who is interested in coming to church, pray with your child about this before each training session).

PRAYER

REFLECT

As parents, encourage your family to personally reflect on the bible passage, and what it means for them. Try to guide this so it lands close to the big idea.

EARLY YEARS / KIDS

Watch the video below and reflect on Daniel 3 with a few questions.

Crossroad Kids' Club - Kid Bible Story: Shadrach Meshach and Abednego



Some comprehension questions to get started:

- What did King Nebuchadnezzar make the Babylonians do?
- Why didn't Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego do it too?
- What was their punishment for not obeying the king?
- Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego were punished, even though they were doing the right thing for God. That's not fair. How did they react? (Discuss how they went to their punishment willingly they trusted God so much!)

YOUTH

Read the Daniel 3 together as a family. Pick a loud song with lots of instruments to play whenever "horn, flute, zither, lyre, harp, pipe and all kinds of music" is mentioned in the passage.

Take some time to reflect on your own life and the things the world around you that say you are more important than God. How is this like what happened in Daniel 3?

PRAY

Dear Lord,

Thank you for being with us by your Spirit in this world when so many other things demand our attention away from you. We are sorry for the times we bow down to idols and give ourselves to things that aren't you. We are especially sorry for those times when we know it is wrong, and we do it anyway. Lord, please help us to be strong and bravely stand up for you, even if we get bullied or punished for it, like Shadrach, Mesach and Abednego.

REACT

As parents, encourage your family to see how they are reacting emotionally to the Bible passage. Engage emotionally and bring it before God.

EARLY YEARS

Read or review Daniel 3 together.
Experience the heat, turn the oven up hot and go and stand near it.
How does it make you feel to be so close to the heat?
How do you think Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego felt standing so close to the furnace, knowing they had to step into it?

KIDS / YOUTH

Read or review Daniel 3 together.
What fiery furnace could you face? (i.e., what punishment/suffering could you face for standing out for God?)
How does that make you feel?
How can you trust Jesus when facing your fiery furnace?

PRAY

Dear God.

You know we want a life that is easy and free from suffering. It is hard to accept that you will not save us from all of that. Thank you that Jesus suffered for us, and that He did not spare Himself that suffering so that we can enjoy eternity with you. Please help us remember Jesus' sacrifice when we are facing the fiery furnaces that might come our way as we live our lives boldly for you. In Jesus' name,

RELATE

As parents, encourage your family to share honestly, and listen deeply to how one another are growing as disciples.


Parents it will be important for you to model honesty and vulnerability as you answer these questions, so your kids know they can do the same. Allow time for everyone to reflect and answer each question openly and honestly. Make sure you listen well to one another, and pray from the heart.

FAMILIES

ABC Teacher Demonstration 'Un-pop-able Balloon' https://www.abc.net.au/science/surfingscientist/pdf/teachdemos_7.pdf

Use the above activity as a fun way of visualising 'facing the flames'. We fear the popping of the balloon (the bad outcome from sharing our faith), but with the Spirit inside us (the water), whatever suffering we endure is not permanent, because of our salvation through Jesus. Discuss how sometimes, like in the story, God spares us the suffering, but sometimes He doesn't. God did not promise that we would not suffer on this earth.

Parents, take this opportunity to be honest about times when you have been persecuted, bullied, excluded or punished for being open about your faith. Also, be honest about the times when the fear of those things has stopped you from sharing your faith and kept you quiet.



PRAY

Dear Lord,

Please be with us when we are afraid to share our faith. We fear the short-term consequences of our actions and the suffering we might face, but Lord, winning people for You should be our greatest and only goal. We don't always know how to do that, the best way to do it, or have the bravery to do it. Please help us in this, and please help us to encourage each other.

RESPOND

As parents, encourage your family to work out real and practical ways they can respond to God in light of the Bible passage. Land the application in this section.

EARLY YEARS

Sing Jesus is the Mighty Mighty King by Colin Buchanan.

Remind yourselves of this week's story in Daniel 3 by changing the lyrics to "Nebuchadnezzar is not the king".



KIDS / YOUTH

Read 1 Peter 3:13-18 together.

Prepare a statement that explains the reason for the hope you have in Jesus.

Role play saying this to each other, trying out some different scenarios where it might come up.

PRAY

Dear God,

Thank you for giving us so many reasons to find hope in Jesus! Please be with us with your Spirit, especially during those times when we have the opportunity to share the reason for our hope. Please help us to be clear and truthful, and please help the people listening to do so with open hearts so that they might want to know you more! In Jesus' name,

REVIEW

As parents, encourage your family to review the Bible passage for the week. This section tries to find a way to engage with the passage in a different way.

EARLY YEARS / KIDS

Challenge your kids' understanding of Daniel chapter 3 with a 'game show' activity, with questions about Daniel 3. Refer back to the comprehension questions from the 'Reflect' section for some question ideas.

YOUTH

Watch the Spoken Gospel video - The Bible Explained: Daniel




How does this video change the way you have been thinking about Daniel so far?
